


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# Clanbook: Salubri (Vampire: The Dark Ages Clanbooks)

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This is a great book. It is very creative, and adds great depth to this misunderstood Bloodline. My only gripe, and it's a big one, is that this book is only for Vampire: Dark Ages. While the concept is interesting, I think it would have been much more interesting to set the book in modern times so that we know what the Bloodline is up to as Gehenna approaches. Specifically, it would be great to know what the Salubri antitribu and the hidden Salubri Healers were doing. Besides the setting, I highly recommend this book.

Salubri are sure the best Clan of Vampire (Dark Ages or Masquerade), they are interesting, versatile, and with a good storyline. They are also the children of Saulot, and this is a good reason to buy this book ^\_^

The Kindred of the Ebony Kingdom includes Salubri healers in great numbers living in Africa since the Tremere events in 1100s ad... The Guide to the Sabbat, brings the Warrior Salubri back, with their own discipline of pain, harm, etc... The Vampire 20th Anniversary Edition itself has collected information in a condensed format. Still would need the other books...

While taking place in the dark ages, the information on the Salubri is far better than what you'll find in any of the other Vampire books. Most of the information explains the attitudes of the Salubri towards their fellow (and rival) clans as well as exactly what goes into the background of one of these enigmatic vampires. Also, the clan's history and possible ties to the (literally) demonic Baali clan are presented as well. I found it to be a great source for even modern characters, as the attitude of defending and healing the weak hasn't really gone out of style. Now, if they'd only come out with a modern-day clanbook.

Something that explains the how and why behind the Childe of Saulot. Most interesting. The explanation of the split of Valeren into the warrior aspect (antitribu's Valeren) and its healing aspect (main-not considering numbers-power Obeah) The mystery about the Baali intrigues me. I can only say that Saulot must have been closer to Malkav, not just in the physical sense, but in the MENTAL sense. The clan was splitting before the Tremere ever came along, much like Saulot's mind.....Primogen Darodine of San Francisco "Fractured is the mind, fractured is the soul, diseased is the blood, you are what you eat. What am I?"

Long are the nights, and full of death and hatred. But there is a clan that rather engages in healing and helping than murder and destruction. This clan, whose members are rarely seen, is Salubri, the clan of Saulot's childe. Saulot, gentle Saulot, first vampire to achieve Golconda. Saulot, merciful

Saulot, who was murdered through betrayal and treachery. Saulot, angellike Saulot, who will be the fate of the Ba'ali.translation from a tablet, suspected to be part of the Book of NodUther Algaan, Assamite Elder - yes, even assassins have an education, you brainless Tremere warlock !

I'm gonna have to get this book sometime. I have always been interested in the smaller clans; salubri, cappadocian, and kiasyd are all real cool.By the old rules there are only 8 salubri alive at a time but now since they are part of the sabbat I'm not sure. I have read through the Book of Nod and I don't remember the passage from the previous reviewer but it did talk about saulot being baal's brother and betraying him to Cain when he started his demon worshipping.Ohh well I hope they come out with a revised Salubri book.

As an avid fan and player of the mysterious Salubri clan, I'm very anxious for the release of this clanbook. So many clans are wrapped in the history of the Salubri, and I hope some of our questions will be soon clarified. How many Salubri ARE there out there? What about the Salubri antitribu?
