


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# Jane Savoie's Dressage 101: The Ultimate Source Of Dressage Basics In A Language You Can Understand

Jane Savoie is the author of many dressage titles, including "Cross-Train Your Horse" and "That Winning Feeling""! She was the reserve rider for the bronze medal-winning dressage team in the 1992 Barcelona Olympics and has won nine Horse of the Year awards as well as three National Freestyle Championships. She divides her time between Berlin, Vermont, and Wellington, Florida.

I am new to dressage and have read many books on the subject, most which seem to complex. This book is straight forward. It is easy to understand, progressively building upon principles and exercises. The pictures are helpful and explanation of aids is easy to understand and apply. This book may be too basic for someone already familiar with dressage, but would be a good outline for

the experienced dressage person to use to brush up on technique or work a new horse through the levels.

Jane Savoie is wonderful and this is a great go-to book to explain dressage principles for people beginning their dressage journey, as well as those more experienced who want to go back and think and read about the basics from time to time. This book addresses everything from the very basic fundamentals, to troubleshooting more difficult movements (up through about fourth level). My copy is well-read and I've bought 2 to give as gifts for friends as well.

This book is extremely clear in explaining so many things that I do on a intuitive level. I learned to do dressage as a teen when there were no books around to explain things. We learned from instructors. My instructor only came once a month as he came for a weekend clinic from 5 hours away. So my time with him was very limited. After reading this book, I have increased my vocabulary and have much deeper understanding of the whys and hows than I ever did. This is an excellent companion to anyone learning dressage. It gives a very rich explanations, concrete info for left brain learners, and excellent analogies to really help with understanding. This is book would be great homework to pair with lessons. It give an excellent intellectual understanding to help a rider to ask the right questions in lessons so she can develop a feel for the movement. Highly recommended to novices and anyone who wants to increase the depth of their understanding and increase their ability to describe their riding experience.
