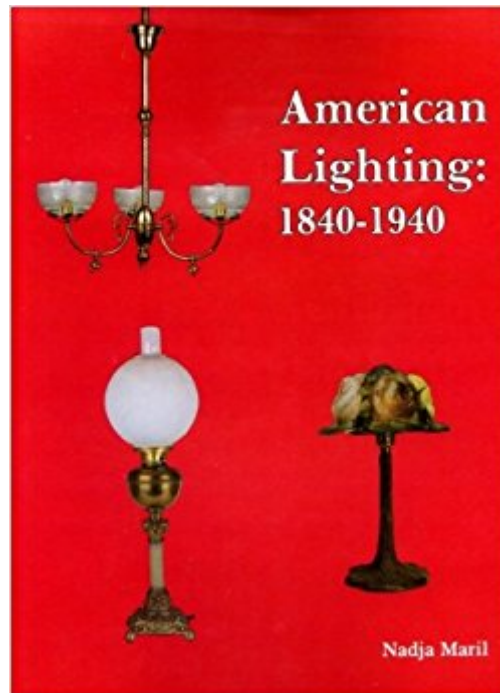

Although the current price guide should be updated and the quality of some of the catalogue reproduction could be improved, this is the best reference book available on the subject. I highly recommend purchasing this book for your library.

Particularly strong in presenting the development of electric lighting, Ms. Maril's text, photographs and catalogue illustrations help to explain the stylistic development of lamps, chandeliers and wall fixtures in the United States during the second half of the 19th century and first half of the 20th century. This book is a helpful resource for both beginning and advanced collectors and it's so attractive, you may want to leave it out on your coffee table!
