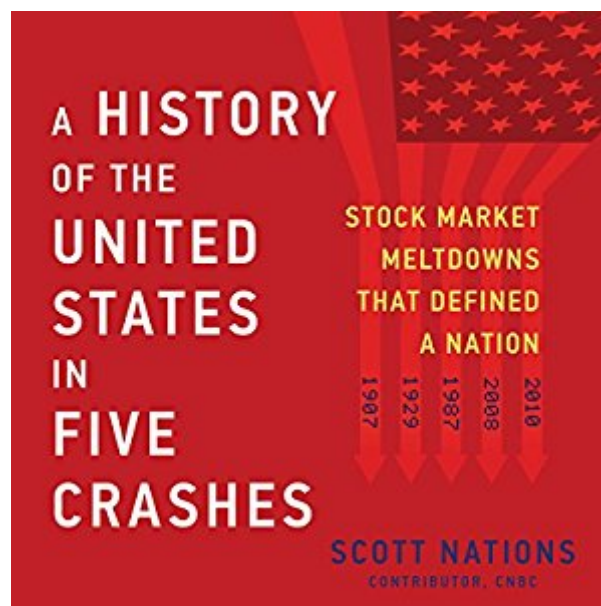

He explores America's love affair with an expanding stock market in the 1980s - which spawned the birth of portfolio insurance that significantly contributed to the 1987 crash. And he examines the factors that led to the 2008 global meltdown and the rise of algorithmic trading, the modern financial technology that sparked the 2010 Flash Crash when American stocks lost a trillion dollars in minutes. *A History of the United States in Five Crashes* clearly and compellingly illustrates the connections between these financial collapses and examines the solid, clear-cut lessons they offer for preventing the next one.

Interesting book and well written. I did not have a sophisticated knowledge of the causes and reasons of the crashes and this book lays it out in a well thought-out manner. I enjoyed it very much!

I think the book is well researched and is written in such a way that folks who are not schooled in economics and finance can get a good understanding of the interplay of politics, monetary policy, and the entrepreneurial spirit affect market performance. It also explains how each crash was preceded by a new financial product that began with good intentions and met a need within the marketplace was eventually taken to an extreme. Eventually the extremes created stresses the market could not tolerate and some catalyst tipped the market into a crash. One thing I did not understand is why the 2000 dotcom bubble and crash was not included in this book. A good book - I enjoyed it.
