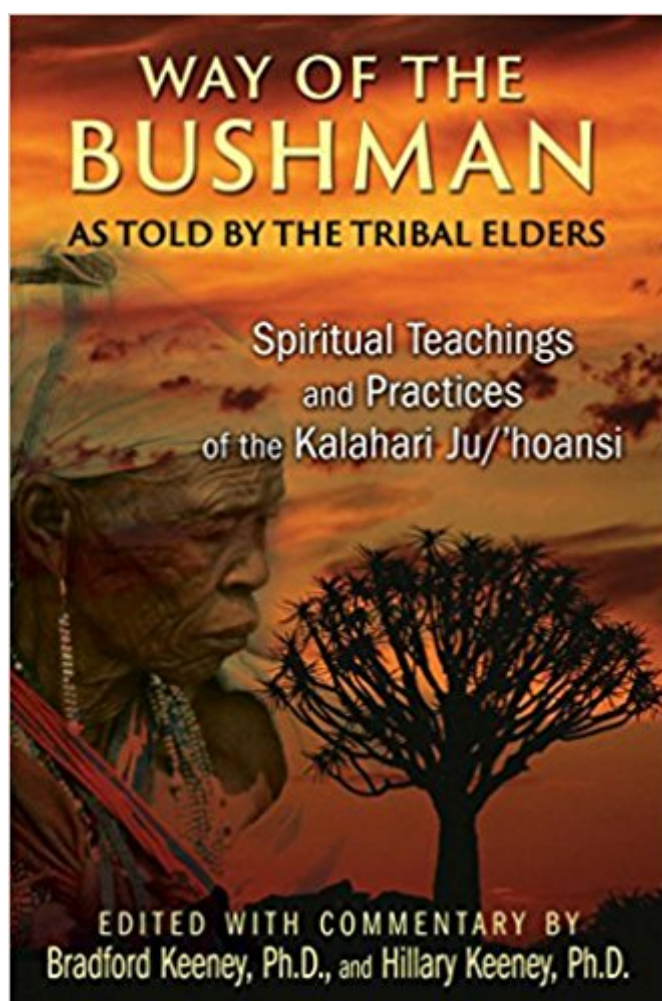


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# Way Of The Bushman: Spiritual Teachings And Practices Of The Kalahari Ju/'hoansi



## Synopsis

The first comprehensive presentation of the core teachings of the Kalahari Bushmen as told by the Tribal Elders. Reveals how the Bushmen are able to receive direct transmissions of God's love for healing and spiritual transformation. Explores tribal legends and teaching tales, the importance of dreams and animals, and the origins of their dances, rituals, and ceremonies. Step into the imaginative realm of one of the oldest continuous cultures on Earth, the Kalahari Ju/'hoansi Bushmen. Translated by Beesa Boo, a Bushman, and interspersed with detailed commentary from Bradford and Hillary Keeney, this book presents the core teachings of the Kalahari Bushmen as told by the tribal elders themselves. Decades in the making, it constitutes the first comprehensive work on the world's oldest tradition of healing and spiritual experience. Told in their own words, these teachings reveal how the Bushmen are able to receive direct transmissions of God's love in the form of the universal life force, *n/om*. The individuals who are filled with this force describe it as an awakened, energized feeling of love that inspires a spontaneous and heightened ecstatic awareness that opens mystical perception. Having your heart transfixed by this force enables true healing and spiritual growth to occur. Experiencing the force in your entire being, through a vision of "God's egg", awakens deep spiritual wisdom and extraordinary healing gifts. Those who "own the egg" are blessed with the ability to have direct communication with the Divine, a "rope to God", and can communicate with others for all "ropes" are connected. Conveying the deep love that is the dominant emotion of Bushman spirituality, the book explores tribal legends and teaching tales, the importance of dreams and encounters with animals, the origins of their dances, such as the giraffe dance, and specific rituals and ceremonies, including puberty rites for boys and girls. "As the elder teachers of the Ju/'hoan Bushman (San) people, we hold the most enduring traditional wisdom concerning healing and spiritual experience. This book is a testimony of our ecstatic ways. We happily share our basic teachings about spirituality and healing with those whose hearts are sincerely open."

Bradford Keeney, Ph.D., is a renowned traditional healer, spiritual teacher, musician, and scholar. His fieldwork with the Kalahari Bushmen (San) in Namibia and Botswana began more than two decades ago. He is the author of many books, including Bushman Shaman and Shaking Medicine. Hillary Keeney, Ph.D., is a traditional healer, spiritual teacher, dancer, scholar, and associate editor of Dance, Movement, and Spirituality. Together the Keeneys cofounded the Keeney Institute for Healing.

The editors of Way of the Bushman have put together a rare gem in the spiritual library of books. This isn’t just a story but the actual words and teachings of the oldest culture we know -- a culture that is becoming extinct and one that does not ordinarily record or write their sacred teachings. From the introduction, the bushman elders give testimony of their ecstatic spiritual universe and proclaim that the strongest healers are almost gone. As I read each page the teachings came alive and I felt happy reading about the ways in which they transform suffering, love God and each other and dance to keep the relationships right with all of creation and mystery. I am intrigued at the ecstatic emotion that comes to the strongest healers by way of dreams and deep feelings of love. The Keeney’s give commentary to many of the core teachings and the insight given is unique in that Bradford Keeney is recognized as a "Heart of the Spears" or one who holds the strongest medicine and knows the ways of the bushmen from personal interaction with the strongest healers for more than a decade. For anyone serious about spirituality and getting a divine connection and learning raw and untamed insight into spiritual life and healing -- I highly recommend this book.

This book is a rare document. It concerns the Bushman of the Kalahari desert, the oldest known culture. As they do, these shaking shaman wake up to their deepest feelings--to a big love for all that guides them in seeing and responding to the sickness in those around them by pulling it out. In this book, Bradford and Hillary Keeney, who are themselves anthropologists and spiritual teachers, have gathered, edited, and helped to explain one of the great healing dance traditions of the human world.
