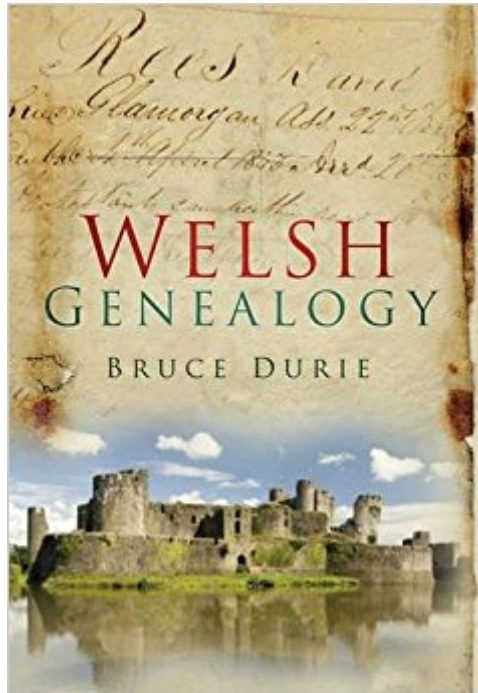

Synopsis

Welsh genealogy is usually included with its English cousin, but there are significant differences between the two, and anyone wishing to trace their Welsh ancestry will encounter peculiarities that are not covered by books on English family history. There is a separate system of archives and repositories for Wales. There are differences in civil registration and censuses: nonconformist registers are different to those of other churches and Welsh surnames and place names are very different to English ones. Welsh Genealogy covers all of this as well as the basic Welsh needed by family historians, estate, maritime, inheritance, education and parish records, peculiarities of law, the Courts of Great Sessions and particular patterns of migration. Written by the highly respected genealogist Bruce Durie, the Course Director for Genealogical Studies at the University of Strathclyde, this is the ideal book for local and family historians setting out on a journey in Welsh ancestry for the first time.

Bruce Durie, a former neuroscientist, is Course Director for Genealogical Studies at the University of Strathclyde, Archivist & Historian to the Chief of the Durie Family and a Fellow of the Society of Antiquaries of Scotland. He is the author of the acclaimed *Scottish Genealogy* (THP, 2009, 2010, 3rd edn forthcoming 2012) and is writing a guide to documents for family and local historians.

This is the third genealogy book I have bought from this author. Due to patronymics, Welsh genealogy can be confusing. Right now I'm kinda stuck in the 1700's. I really like how Professor

(Dr?) Durie provides example documents and helpful strategies in his books to get unstuck. I haven't read a whole lot of this one yet because I'm still working through the two I bought about Scotland, but so far it looks as amazingly helpful as those two ("Scottish Genealogy" and "Documents for Genealogists")

There is a wealth of practical genealogical information in this book. Like most amateurs, I had many profound misconceptions about tracking down my Welsh ancestors. Aside from providing helpful information, this book also served the useful purpose of constraining my expectations and focusing my research into more productive areas.
