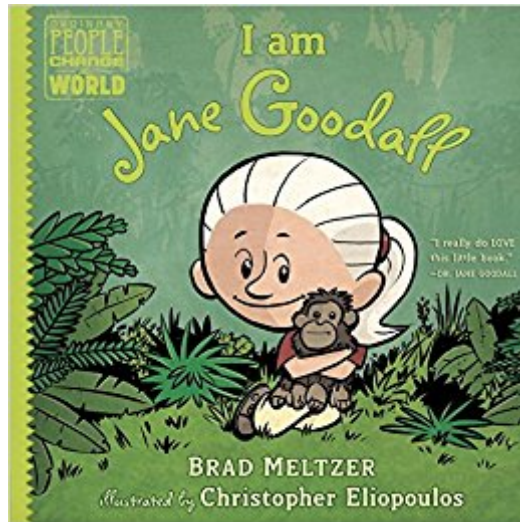

I love all these books. What a great way to introduce kids to historical figures. And my 3 year old loves them. They fully hold her attention. It's adorable to hear her say That's Jane, she likes animals

Wow! if I could collect all the books, I think I would based on this one book. Good illustrations (resemble the art of the cartoonists who did Calvin and Hobbes). Simplified to the level my 4 and 6 year olds appreciated and understood. The author didn't talk down to them, rather at their level. Not too simple, though, there was plenty to learn.

We have the whole series of this set. This one is probably my least favorite of the women in comparison to Lucille Ball, Rosa Parks, Helen Keller or Amelia Earhart it just seems like maybe there was less to tell about Jane or maybe the others just seemed more mysterious so those books seem more interesting. The series is very neat to introduce young readers to people who have changed the world there is no doubt about that. I think if you have a reader interested in Zoology or animals in general they might appreciate this more than I did!

We are using this as part of our Kindergarten social studies curriculum to introduce famous humanitarians, activists, and scientists. These book capture their attention and because they are drawn as children, kids can relate. They are chalk full of interesting people and their unique characters that break the mold. I think having these as a reference point to people who were not always loved by society and worked through much opposition in life has helped reiterate that fitting into the standard mold is not all it's cracked up to be and allows that to feel good about them being who they are and finding comfort in that. We love this series and can't wait for more.

Lots of words for a picture book. Reading level is higher than my 1st grade granddaughter reads. Will save for a year or two. Great content, though. Love Brad Meltzer.
